



Quite a lot of techniques use the ribber with a few suitable on the single bed. Of course, we can always relatch, but I personally think this is going to be very unsatisfactory.

Bill's How-to covers every type of cable you'd ever think - or not think of for that matter. It has about 4 basic garments and so many cables to try out to put into your own patterns. Most definitely worth getting. The paper book is just under the \$40. The Book Depository in the UK has free worldwide shipping, Amazon has the kindle version for around \$20.

Thought you might be interested, I've converted some of mums (Mary McCallum) tension swatches into Tea cosies. My husband loves teapots and we needed some new cosies. Her knitting is not wasted... Regards Sue




Entered a new basic shape and doing the necessary drawing was the next step. Margaret had been asked to make a jumper with a beautiful grey mohair but unfortunately it would not knit on any of her machines. Sideways weaving was the result, and a very impressive jumper came into being,

With our new shape over the next few months, we are going to produce a sideways garment that we can knit to any stitch that will fit.

The afternoon session we did a scallop edge with a latch cast on, repeated again after a couple of rows then a lace stitch which formed scallops a very pretty edge for baby wear or some other place where a wavy edge is required

The next meeting will be at Margaret and Mick's at Point Clare on the 1st April..
