'BUBBLE and SQUEAK' MACHINE KNITTING WORKSHOP by Angela McGregor

SATURDAY, 5TH AUGUST, 2023

Bubble and Squeak is a traditional English dish made with fried leftover vegetables from a roast dinner. The main ingredients are potato and cabbage/brussel sprouts and any other leftover vegetables. Meat, eggs, onion, salt, pepper and herbs can be added. A splash of Worchester sauce makes it even better.

The taste and smell of Bubble and Squeak can be even more delicious than the original roast dinner. The thing about using leftovers is that every time you make Bubble and Squeak you never get exactly the same meal. Each Bubble and Squeak meal is an original.

Bubble and Squeak knitting is about using up your leftovers and creating something new.

Every machine knitter I have ever met has 'leftover' yarns lurking in their cupboards.

I would like to request that all people attending bring along 1 or 2 cones of 'leftover' yarn (ranging from very fine to 4 ply).

DEFINITION OF LEFTOVER YARNS

There are cones of yarn that have been lurking in the back our yarn cupboards for a long time. Why?

- you hate the colour
- they are left over from a previous project
- something you picked up at a sale but don't really like
- you have no idea what to do with them

- had for so long that you don't have the heart to throw them out

someone gave them to you after they had a clean out
 you have tried to sell them or even give them away but
 no one else wants them- even the moths and other little
 bugs don't like them

This workshop is suitable for experienced machine knitters and beginners. Easy to follow patterns will be provided. Book Review and an Idea for a Different Technique for Punchcard less Fair Isle

Ellen Hall (Cal USA) from MKC knit club was telling us about a technique she found in an old magazine using the fair isle setting and needles in hold to knit her float less intarsia charity blanket. I took the idea to Epping Thursday May meeting to see how to and if we could also do a simple small fair isle.

Set up Machine: set to Fair Isle. Yarns in A and B in the sinker plate feeder.

HOLD levers/button OFF.

Position the needles: leave the needles closest to the carriage in WP to knit Col A in A slot then pull all the needles out into hold where you want to knit the second Col B in the B slot. And knit a row for intarsia (or selected patterns for a small motif).

Subsequent Intarsia rows, Barbara found wrapping Col A onto the first needle Col B, leaving Col A on the top of the needles in HOLD for Col B to knit, worked best.

So, then I decided that I quite liked that idea and got out my NOT machine knitting OR newly published book (2018) **AlterKnit** with (yet again) How to knit chapters, a couple of projects in the last chapters but In between are 200 of the most marvellous small motifs, just perfect for a small

amount of embellishment that I wouldn't do a punchard for anyway.

Now that's how I intend to use the book. Perfect for Electronic users as is. However, it may not appeal to punchard users, there are some that with a stitch added here and there *could* be punched into a card. Some nice 8, 12 and 18 sts patterns. I will

punch one of the 12s to use on my SK155. I've used one motif (28S x17R) for a spider themed jumper for my spiderman mad grandson. Widths vary from about 6ish to 30ish sts for 8 to 30ish and a lone 50 rows.

Here's the book details:

AlterKnit Stitch Dictionary by Andrea Rangel - US <u>Amazon</u>. AUS <u>Booktopia</u>. UK <u>Blackwells</u> I bought the <u>Chinese edition</u>, half the price of the English books from AliExpress. I don't want to read yet again, How To Knit! Never was going to read the English anyway. But I also think the Kindle version would be really good – If you want it just for just the motifs. (\$19 Kindle to \$25-45 paper).




Barbara figured it out and played with the idea.

Book Review – Discovering Machine Knitting by Kandy Diamond

From the publisher, **Crowood Press**: The ultimate guide to machine knitting. This book has been designed to help you demystify machine knitting. Perfect for beginners, it starts with how the machine works and how stitches are formed, all the way through to shaping garment panels to your desired size and fit. Each chapter focuses on different skills that build throughout the book, with lots of projects so you can put the skills into practice and make some knits for yourself.

Designer Profiles at the end of each chapter showcase the work of professional machine knitters to provide context, inspiration and celebrate the huge potential for creativity in machine knitting. From troubleshooting and looking after the machine to using more advanced techniques such as intarsia and shaping, this book will help you fall in love with your knitting machine. If you work through the stepby-step instructions and projects in this book, by the end of it you will be designing and knitting your own garments!

That does do justice to describing the book. And what did I think of it? It is a must for new knitters. So, you've learnt how to cast on – but what can you make now? Each chapter has simple designs to make from the technique described. (And yes! I've already got a slip of paper in one for a better way of doing something, not telling which one either!). It just goes to show, there's never one way to do anything on our machines – always a new idea to learn make something differently!

The colour photos are vibrant, clear and wonderful. (Really wonderful!) The HowTo photos are very clear and would have been helpful when I was learning.

Prices do vary – book and delivery is in the mid \$40s and the ebooks are in the mid \$20s.



FLAT SOCK DEMONSTRATION AT EPPING CREATIVE CENTRE13/6/23

The demonstration began at 10.00am after everyone had set up their main bed machine ready to begin. A really good idea especially for those who are new at knitting. The flat sock is much easier for "newbies" to tackle before going on to the circular one.

The morning was the flat sock which has a seam up the side (either inside or outside) depending on which the knitter wanted.

The notes were well written and as I have been knitting for a while I found them easy to follow and could continue on without help. Those who did need help were able to get someone to aid them if they needed it. By lunch time this sock was finished or well on the way.

After lunch was a sock knitted from the hem to heel, foot, toe, instep then hem to finish. After knitting the toe the foot and instep were joined to make a sock like a circular one but without having to use a ribber. The hems joined by hand to make a completed sock

It was a very good demonstration and the knitter could decide which was more suitable for them.

Congratulations to the demonstrators a really good workshop.


