Hoping you are all keeping well and safe.



### All knitted Kitchen Towel from Lorna Roache

I took measurements from one of Eleanor's Favs.

I use 4ply cotton.

Measured Eleanor's towel and topper: 40cm wide 30 cm long then topper. So this is what I ended up doing.

**L = double length** – I think it's Card 7? Don't know, I use the elongated lever thingy

#### S = single length.

Card 1 - elongated T7

CO 90

RC000

RC2

Select TUCK, L, to RC 32

Select SLIP, S, MT+3, to RC 42

Select TUCK, L, MT, to RC 220

Knit 4 RC 224

Take off all sts from the machine, my preferred method is on long circular needles.

(Eleanor's old towel topper: Started with the 90 sts which need to be reduced to 50 sts.)

Turn work over, moving carriage to the other side (*you've taken OFF THE WORK in case you're reading ahead and forgot I said to do that*)

Put the first (and last) 5 sts onto the machine starting on L25/R25 then put 2 sts on the next 40 needles (dec 2 tog on L20/R20) till 5 sts are left, then place them on the remaining 5 needles 5/40/5 (90 sts becomes 50)

Knit 2 rows RC 226

Next Dec every 3 row till 32 sts are left

(28 rows 32 sts RC 244)

RC 245 halve sts to 16sts (take off like before and put 2 sts on each needle)

RC 246 side dec 14 sts

RC 248 dec 1 in the middle 15 sts

RC 251 side dec (2) and 2 sts in the middle (3 sts in total)

9 sts remain (but I think 10sts was better – so adjust around to it works out that way)

about 20 rows RC280

then buttonhole:

2 centre sts to next needle, take one out of work

knit 1 row

place the dangling bit of yarn onto the left needle, bring needle back into work.

Knit3 more rows

cast off AGP

### FROM A COUNTRY KNITTER

The American website Knititnow (knititnow.com) offers a range of dynamic, 'any stitch, any yarn, any gauge', knitting patterns. Earlier this year (in search of inspiration for a jumper for first granddaughter) my attention was caught by the Knititnow dynamic update of a vintage machine knitting pattern called 'Tuck Baby Trio'.

The original pattern was a closely striped, tuck stitched, baby jumper, teamed with plain leggings and a tuck stitched, striped, baby blanket, knitted at a standard gauge of 40 stitches and 60 rows. The little jumper had a shaped front neckline, a back neck opening and a deep, button band placket, with 3 buttons. Bramwell fine 4-ply was the original yarn choice, in pastel shades.

I decided to give the pattern a go on my LK150, using a merino baby yarn at a gauge of 26 stitches and 36 rows for 10 cm. The yarn colours are dark blue, magenta and lemon. I used a simple colour block design in stocking stitch, with mock rib cuffs and welt, rather than the original stripes and tuck.

Happy to report that the choice of three kitten shaped buttons met with the baby's enthusiastic approval. (I could have just sent her a packet of buttons, of course, but a whole jumper is harder to chew!)


Our new venue Edgeworth Bowling Club
